

Call for Applications: Project Assistant Professor in Mathematical Sciences

Graduate School of Mathematical Sciences, the University of Tokyo, promotes the investigation of fundamental problems in mathematics and to act as a leader in the exploration of new research fields in the mathematical sciences.

We invite applications for a project assistant professorship for up to five years in mathematical sciences through Leading Initiative for Excellent Young Researchers (LEADER) of The Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology (MEXT). We plan to hire one for this tenure-track position. The promotion to a tenure position will be considered in the Japanese academic year 2020. The actual hiring will begin on October 1, 2017, or as early as possible after this date. The average salary is about 5,500,000 yen/year and in addition a health insurance plan will be provided. The salary is based on the regular salary scale of our university and thus depends on the academic carrier of the applicant. As for teaching, regular assistant professors of our graduate school, in principle, teach exercises in Japanese.

Applicants are requested to submit the application to Leading Initiative for Excellent Young Researchers (LEADER) of The Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology (MEXT), JAPAN and choose our institution to be the employer.
